☐ You will need to arrange a DVLA 'D4' medical, this can be booked with your GP, or we recommend booking with https://d4drivers.uk who offer great rates and flexible appointments.	https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/d4- medical-examiner-report-for-a-lorry-or-bus-driving- licence
☐ You will need to complete the 'D2' provisional application form and send this with your completed 'D4' medical form to: DVLA, Swansea, SA99 1BR.	https://www.gov.uk/dvlaforms There is no fee for adding the provisional entitlement.
☐ Once you receive your updated driving licence back from the DVLA check you have had the correct provisional entitlement added.	To check your entitlements: www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence
☐ Now you have your updated licence, J17 can arrange your theory tests and set up an online revision account. (Module 1 – Hazard Perception & Multiple Choice, 2 & 4 – Driver CPC Initial Qualification)	https://www.gov.uk/become-lorry-bus-driver/driver-cpc-part-2-case-studies-test
☐ If you do not pass the first time you can retake them, you do not have to take them all again only the ones you did not pass.

☐ If you are driving professionally, you will also need to complete your 35 hours of DCPC over a 5-year period. J17 can also arrange these courses for you at our JAUPT approved training centre.	https://www.junction17ddt.com/courses
☐ If you gained your C Licence prior to 10 th September 2009 or you passed your car licence (category B) before 1 st January 1997 then you have grandfather/acquired rights which allows you to drive without the Cat C modules/tests, however you will still need to undertake the 35 hours DCPC training if you wish to drive professionally.	https://www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence
